Terms governing use of the RSA.Irish educational trainer, including educational disclaimers, intellectual-property rules, voluntary donations and limitations of liability.

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1. About RSA.Irish and acceptance

RSA.Irish (Rural Speed Ambition) is an independent educational project operated by Stanyslav Metlushko and designed to help learners prepare for the Irish Driver Theory Test and learn road-related English. In the project name, “RSA” means Rural Speed Ambition and is not a reference to the Road Safety Authority. RSA.Irish is not the Road Safety Authority (RSA), Prometric, TheoryTest.ie, the Department of Transport, or any government body, and is not endorsed, sponsored or approved by them unless expressly stated in writing by the relevant organisation.

By creating an account where registration is available, or by actively accepting these Terms and continuing to use the service, you agree to these Terms of Use and the Privacy Policy, version 2026-08-14.3. If you do not agree, do not use the service.

These Terms form an electronic agreement. The service may record the version and date/time of acceptance for registered accounts.

2. Educational purpose; no guarantee

The service is provided for education, practice and language learning only. Practice questions, explanations, translations, scores, readiness indicators and mock exams are not official examination questions and are not a substitute for current official rules, legislation, RSA guidance or the official Driver Theory Test service.

Road rules, speed limits, procedures, signs, examination content and official guidance can change. RSA.Irish aims to maintain accurate material but does not warrant that every item is complete, current or error-free. Users should verify important or safety-critical information against current official sources before relying on it.

No score, progress percentage, streak, mock-exam result or other indicator guarantees that a user will pass an official examination, obtain a licence, drive safely or meet any legal requirement.

3. Safety and reliance disclaimer

Do not use the service while driving or in any situation where distraction may create danger. The service is not a navigation system, emergency service, legal advice, professional driving instruction or substitute for qualified instruction.

You remain responsible for your own driving decisions, compliance with law and checking current road signs and conditions. In any conflict between RSA.Irish content and applicable law, an official road sign, a Garda direction, an authorised traffic controller, or current official guidance, the applicable law or official direction prevails.

4. User accounts and acceptable use

We do not promise uninterrupted availability, permanent storage of progress, compatibility with every device, or that third-party links and services will remain available.

8. Limitation of liability

9. Privacy and data protection

RSA.Irish applies the Privacy Policy published with these Terms. Where personal data is collected, users must be given transparent information about the controller, purposes, legal bases, categories of data, recipients, retention, transfers and data-subject rights as applicable under GDPR and Irish data-protection law.

The trainer stores local learning progress and legal-gate state in localStorage on the user's device. Registered accounts use Supabase authentication and may process name, email, mobile number, language preference, account status, learning progress, mock-exam history, consent records, security logs and related account metadata for the purposes described in the Privacy Policy. Contact emails are processed through the user's email provider and the project mailbox.

10. Governing law and disputes

These Terms are governed by the laws of Ireland, subject to any mandatory rights or jurisdiction protections available to consumers under Irish or EU law. Nothing in these Terms deprives a consumer of protections that cannot be waived by contract.

Before bringing a formal claim, users are encouraged to contact Freersa.Irish@gmail.com with a clear description of the issue so that it can be investigated and, where appropriate, corrected.

11. Severability and entire terms

If any provision is held invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions continue in effect and the affected provision is limited or replaced only to the extent necessary to make it lawful. Failure to enforce a provision on one occasion does not waive it.

Privacy Policy

How RSA.Irish processes learner account data, local learning progress, support correspondence and security records.

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1. Who controls the data

Data Controller: Stanyslav Metlushko, operator of the RSA.Irish independent educational project.
Data-protection and legal contact: Freersa.Irish@gmail.com. RSA.Irish is a project name and does not replace the Controller’s legal identity. If the service is later transferred to a company or other legal entity, this Privacy Policy will be updated before that entity becomes the controller.

2. What the current trainer stores

The learner application stores practice progress, mistakes, settings and local legal-gate state in browser localStorage on the user’s device. When a learner creates or uses an account, the service also processes the registered-account data described below through Supabase authentication and the project database. Learning statistics may be synchronised to the registered account when the user is authenticated.

If you email the project, the project processes the information in your message and associated email metadata in order to respond and keep necessary correspondence records. If you use the Monobank support link, the payment is handled on Monobank’s external service under its own privacy terms.

3. Data processed for registered accounts

Registered account data includes or may include first name, email address, mobile phone number, preferred language, verification/account status, login and activity timestamps, planned test date, learning progress, mock-exam history, bookmarks/mistakes, consent timestamps and legal-policy version, and security/audit information.

4. Purposes and legal bases

Account administration and requested educational service: processing necessary to provide requested account functionality and service.

Security, abuse prevention, audit and service integrity: legitimate interests in protecting users and the service, balanced against user rights.

Legal compliance and handling rights requests: compliance with applicable legal obligations.

Optional communications or analytics, if introduced: a separate lawful basis and consent mechanism will be used where required. The current build does not include advertising cookies or third-party analytics.

5. Recipients and processors

Hosting, database and authentication providers such as Vercel and Supabase process data on behalf of the project subject to their contracts and applicable data-protection requirements. Gmail/Google processes project email. Monobank processes payment-support transactions when the user leaves the site for the external payment page.

The project does not sell personal data. Data may be disclosed where required by law or reasonably necessary to establish, exercise or defend legal claims.

6. International transfers

Some processors may handle data outside Ireland or the EEA. Where GDPR requires safeguards, appropriate transfer mechanisms must be used by the relevant controller/processor.

7. Retention

Local learning progress stays on the device until the user resets progress, clears browser storage, or removes site data.

Registered profile and learning records are kept while the account is active. After a verified deletion request, deletion or anonymisation is scheduled within 30 days, except for narrowly necessary legal, fraud-prevention, security, or dispute records.

Administrative/security audit records are normally retained for 12 months. Support and legal correspondence may be retained for up to 24 months after the matter is closed. Payment-card credentials are not received by RSA.Irish; the external payment provider applies its own retention rules.

These periods are reviewed at least annually and whenever the service's purposes or processors materially change.

8. Security

RSA.Irish uses reasonable technical and organisational measures for account and admin data, including managed authentication, email verification, restricted database access and multi-factor authentication for administrative access. No internet system is absolutely secure. Do not send passwords or sensitive payment credentials by email.

9. Changes

Material changes to this Privacy Policy will be dated and, where required, brought to registered users' attention. New processing incompatible with the existing legal basis will not be silently introduced.
